- 2. What 'joy' has God worked in us? "These things I have spoken to you that <u>My joy may remain in you</u>, and that your joy may be full." *John 15:11*
- 3. What was the joy of Jesus? *Heb 12:2; Psalm 40:8*

A. Count it all Joy...

... or How to 'count' things as loss for Christ

1. *Count:* Gk hegeomai—to lead or go before! Metaphorically to lead with the mind, to determine value. Knowing Christ changes how I value things in my life.

James 1:2 ...count it all joy...trials... Phil 3:1; 3; 4; 7; 8 (See sidebar verses in blue)

B. Confidence: Gain or Loss? <u>Do not put your confidence in these:</u>

- 1. <u>Dogs</u> :2 False teachers—contrary to God's Word—those who offer 'another way' or 'secret way'
- 2. <u>Evil workers</u> :2 Profession without possession. Say they are believers but are not—proven by their evil works.
- 3. <u>False circumcision</u> :2 Outward sign-no inward change! Working for, not out salvation. See Phil 2:12
- 4. <u>The flesh</u> :4-6
 - ...circumcised the eighth day
 - ...of the nation of Israel
 - ... of the tribe of Benjamin
 - ...a Hebrew of Hebrews
 - ...as to the law, a Pharisee
 - ...as to zeal, a persecutor of the church

...as to righteousness – found blameless

C. Confidence: Gain or Loss?

<u>Do</u> put your confidence in these:

- 1. <u>Circumcision</u> of the <u>*heart*</u> true circumcision :3
- 2. <u>Worship</u> [in the Spirit of God and glory of Christ :3
- 3. Knowledge of Christ Jesus :8; 10
- 4. <u>Righteousness</u> that is from God by faith :9
- 5. <u>Power of His resurrection</u> :10
- 6. <u>Fellowship</u> of His suffering :10
- 7. <u>Conformed</u> to His death :10

Perfecting Joy: The Book of Philippians Joy of Gain Through Loss

Philippians 3:1-11

:1 Finally, my brethren, rejoice in the Lord. For me to write the same things to you *is* not tedious, but for you *it is* safe [a safeguard].

:2 Beware of (B1) <u>dogs</u>, beware of (B2) <u>evil workers</u>, beware of (B3) <u>the mutilation</u>!

:3 For we are the (C1) <u>circumci-</u> sion, (C2) <u>who worship God in the</u> <u>Spirit</u>, rejoice in Christ Jesus, and have no confidence in the flesh,

:4 though I also might have confidence in the flesh. If anyone else thinks he may have confidence in the flesh, I more so:

:5 circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel, *of* the tribe of Benjamin, a Hebrew of the Hebrews; concerning the law, a Pharisee;

:6 concerning zeal, persecuting the church; concerning the righteousness which is in the law, blameless.

:7 But what things were gain to me, these I have <u>counted</u> loss for Christ.

:8 Yet indeed I also count all things loss for the (C₃) <u>excellence</u> of the knowledge of Christ Jesus my Lord, for whom I have suffered the loss of all things, and count them as rubbish, that I may gain Christ

:9 and be found in Him, not having my own righteousness, which *is* from the law, but that which *is* through faith in Christ, (C4) <u>the righteousness which is</u> from God by faith;

:10 that I may (C₃) <u>know Him</u> and the (C₅) <u>power of His</u> <u>resurrection</u>, and the (C₆) <u>fellow-</u> <u>ship of His sufferings</u>, being (C₇) conformed to His death,

:11 if, by any means, I may attain to the resurrection from the dead.
