

Thanksgiving 2008 Streams in the Desert — Harvest of Joy

With Thanksgiving

"Be anxious for nothing, but in everything <u>by prayer</u> and <u>supplication</u>, <u>with thanksgiving</u>, let your requests be made known to God; <u>and the peace of God</u>, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus." *Phil 4:6-7*

Introduction: After 70 years in captivity the people of God start the return trip to Zion. It's like a dream! And when you and I are set free from the bondage of sin and death and the *[captivity]* of this world—it is cause for giving thanks.

A. A Dream Comes True :1-3 Thankful for Salvation

- 1. When we realize what God has done for us by His grace we can hardly believe it—it's like a dream *:1*
- 2. This is a call to thanksgiving :2
- 3. Even the nations *[goyim]* recognized the mighty works of God. *:2*
- 4. At last the people 'own the joy' :3

B. A *Desert* Blooms :4 *Thankful for Sanctification*

- 1. Like the Negev that was arid and barren, so were the spiritual lives of the people.
- 2. The wilderness would blossom after the seasonal rains just as we blossom as the Spirit rains down (*or in and through*) us. *Acts 1:8; John 7:37-39*
- 3. This may also be a metaphor of a coming harvest of souls that starts as a trickle and soon is a roaring river.

C. A Door is Opened :5-6 Thankful for the Harvest

- 1. Once the river of verse :4 starts to flow—it is a sign of future abundance.
- 2. The Israelites had to rebuild the land so they could live in it. It was a painfully slow process of replanting the fields, growing the livestock and building shelter.
- 3. As we have been saved by grace—we must take the message of the gospel using the 'river of living water' [the Holy Spirit John 7:37-39] as our source of power and life—and sow into the lives of those around us. [See also Matt 13:1-9; 18-23 Parable of the Sower]
 4. We need to have the same burden for
- 4. We need to have the same burden for 'restoring' [saving] the lost that the Israelites had for restoring the land.
- 5. Tears turn to thanksgiving and joy when the harvest is brought in. :6

Psalm 126 NKJV

:1 A Song of Ascents. When the LORD brought back the captivity of Zion, <u>we were</u> <u>like those who dream</u>.

:2 Then our mouth was filled with laughter, and our tongue with singing. Then they said among the nations, "The LORD has done great things for them."

:3 The LORD has done great things for us, <u>and we are glad</u>.

:4 Bring back our captivity, O LORD, as the streams in the South [Negev].

:5 Those who sow in tears shall reap in joy.

:6 He who continually goes forth weeping, bearing seed for sowing, shall doubtless come again with rejoicing, bringing his sheaves *with him*.

Psalm 126 NLT

:1 A song for pilgrims ascending to Jerusalem. When the LORD brought back His exiles to Jerusalem, it was like a dream!

:2 We were filled with laughter, and we sang for joy. And the other nations said, "What amazing things the LORD has done for them."

:3 Yes, the LORD has done amazing things for us! What joy!

:4 <u>Restore our fortunes,</u> <u>LORD, as streams renew the</u> <u>desert</u>.

:5 Those who plant in tears will harvest with shouts of joy.

:6 They weep as they go to plant their seed, but they sing as they return with the harvest.
