What Does Hosanna Mean?

Triumphal Entry—Going and Letting Go

Introduction: What does 'hosanna' mean? The Greek form of a Hebrew term used at the triumphal entry of Jesus into Jerusalem (*Mt. 21:9, 15; Mk. 11:9; Jn. 12:13*). It means 'help now' or '*save now*,' and occurs in Psalm 118:25.

Mathew 21:1-11; Luke 19:40-41

1. Are you *NOW* available to go or let go?

- :1 Now when they drew near Jerusalem, and came to Bethphage, at the Mount of Olives, then Jesus sent two disciples.
- :2 saying to them, "Go into the village opposite you, and immediately you will find a donkey tied, and a colt with her. Loose them and bring them to Me.
- **:3** And if anyone says anything to you, you shall say, 'The Lord has need of them,' <u>and</u> immediately he will send them."
- **:4** All this was done that it might be fulfilled which was spoken by the prophet, saying:
- :5 "TELL THE DAUGHTER OF ZION, 'BEHOLD, YOUR KING IS COMING TO YOU, LOWLY, AND SITTING ON A DONKEY, A COLT, THE FOAL OF A DONKEY.' "
 - :6 So the disciples went and did as Jesus commanded them.
- :7 They brought the donkey and the colt, laid their clothes on them, and set *Him* on them.

2. Are you <u>NOW</u> available to praise Him?

- **:8** And a very great multitude spread their clothes on the road; others cut down branches from the trees and spread *them* on the road.
- :9 Then the multitudes who went before and those who followed cried out, saying: "Hosanna to the Son of David! 'BLESSED IS HE WHO COMES IN THE NAME OF THE LORD!' Hosanna in the highest!"

3. Are you <u>NOW</u> available to speak out for Him?

Luke 19:39-41 But some of the Pharisees among the crowd said, "Teacher, rebuke Your followers for saying things like that!" **:40** He replied, "If they kept quiet, the stones along the road would burst into cheers!" **:41** But as He came closer to Jerusalem and saw the city ahead, He began to weep.

4. Are you <u>NOW</u> available to recognize His presence?

:10 And when He had come into Jerusalem, all the city was moved, saying, "Who is this?":11 So the multitudes said, "This is Jesus, the prophet from Nazareth of Galilee."
